Please join us at our monthly Board Meetings on the 3rd Wednesday each month at 2:00^{pm} in the Town Hall to learn more.



What responsibilities do Boards of Director's hold?
Why do we have Governing Documents and why must we adhere to them?

The Board of Directors has not abdicated all responsibility to PMP Management, and/or the General Manager, Janet Garcia. The Board is continually active in decision making and exercises its fiduciary duty to ensure that the best decisions and efforts are made on behalf of the membership (all of you). I meet with the Board President weekly basis and speak with other board members several times a week. In addition, they receive a weekly update on all ongoing projects. Mary Lee, the Board Treasurer, and I monitor the financials, very closely. We review all invoices and expenses to ensure accuracy.

Golf Course Improvement Project Timeline Golf Course closed until complete

Golf Course Improvements Include:

- Week of May 15th Kill all the grass and weeds
- Upgrade Irrigation System Replace all 1 inch pipe with 2 inch pipe, replace all sprinkler heads to properly water the course.
- Remove all dead grass and top layer of grass substructure.
- July after all golf improvements are complete, replace new grass and greens.
- → July 17th Golf Course Grand Reopening.

We will keep you informed of the progress along the way.

Tennis / Pickleball Court Resurfacing Project

The much-anticipated resurfacing and striping project will finally happen in **June**. The project was put on hold due to weather and scheduling. According to the vendor, the project is tentatively on schedule for **June 12**.

The Tennis/Pickleball Court will not be open for use until the project is complete.

Trash Enclosures Rules

Residents, dumping of bulk items in the trash bins or enclosures is prohibited. Residents are required to arrange for pickup with **Bulk Pickup.** Ask the office for the form. Fines will be assessed to residents caught leaving bulk items, or if it can be traced to the contractors working on resident units.
