

Election Update

Our scheduled 2023 Annual Meeting and Election Results on **April 11, 2023,** had to be rescheduled for **May 10, 2023.** The Election failed to reach the required quorum of total ballots. This is the second time in the last **three years** the Association has not met election guidelines. The Association is required to follow all the rules and regulations in accordance with State guidelines. The following was done with the intent of making our election a success.

- The Newsletter announced the election opening and requested Nominations to the Board,
- Outside election service was hired to conduct the election,
- Nominee participation was encouraged in the Newsletter to ensure Owners had a variety of choices,
- A Candidate Night was held which allowed members to meet, question and become familiar with the Nominees,
- Ballots were sent out in accordance with the hired election service guidance and election timeline,
- Throughout the process, the Newsletter kept the members/residents informed of the process, the Nominees, Candidates Night, Ballot mailing dates and subsequent Election Night Annual Meeting announcement.

The Association did all this having made every effort in accordance with the State mandated rules and procedures and that the voter pool was cognizant of the process in a timely manner.

The Association can only do so much to drum up enthusiasm in getting members to vote. When we fall short of our voting efforts, disappointment in the lack of involvement and interest in the Association is felt deeply.

Elections matter and having representation matters in the day-to-day decisions brought before the Board. According to our By-Laws:

3.11 Quorum and Approval Requirements. More than fifty percent (50%) of the Voting Power of the Association shall constitute a quorum at all matters shall be a majority of the votes cast at a duly held meeting at which at least 301 valid ballots are cast.

Your Voice, Your Vote, Your Power

When we all vote, we make a difference in our community.

In conclusion, every Owner is a member of the Association and is automatically registered and able to vote in every election. Together, all six hundred Owners have an opportunity to effectuate a positive result in the makeup of the Board resulting in policies that represent the whole Association membership. We must reach out to all the members that the election is of the highest importance and that everyone's vote counts. In future elections, we must reach out to our neighbors and ask:

"Did you get your ballot? Did you vote?"

Let us ensure that we hear from all the voters and that we as a community care about each other and our Association.

This is a perfect way to meet residents, become part of the activities and benefit from the camaraderie. The more active and team minded volunteers our community has, the more actions can be undertaken. The result is a better place to live. 
March Golf Tournament



Affordable Internet for Seniors

If you or someone you know needs help paying for internet service, you may qualify for a **monthly** discount on a new or existing internet service plan through a government program called the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). You may also qualify for a one-time device discount of up to \$100, to buy a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers.

To apply, visit AffordableConnectivity.gov or call **1-877-384-2575** to request an application. Once your application is approved, you can contact a **participating internet service provider** to start receiving your monthly discount. Only one monthly service discount and one device discount is allowed per household.





The regular Board meeting of Monday, November 20, 1989 by Chairman Bob Talley at 7:30 P.M. All Board members were present except Megill.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, the minutes of the October 16, 1989 meeting and the Special meeting of November 2, 1989 were approved as presented.

When you receive your proposed and projected budget for 1990 in mid-November, the Buildings and Pools Committee recommend that you carefully study these documents, and we ask that you pay particular attention to the roofing section. When the \$10 assessment and later the \$25 assessment (total \$35) were approved, our reserves were earning far more interest than they are now earning with future projections possibly even lower. Also with "Hugo" on the East Coast and the "Quake" in the San Francisco Bay area, our building materials are more expensive than forecast due to normal supply and demand procedures. As a result our committee must make all owners aware of these facts as we enter into our second year of our five-year plan to re-roof all of our residential buildings and plan for the completion of our garages, gym and Clubhouse.

Our new roofs have greatly improved the appearance along Maple Avenue, and it is our opinion the work has been done in an excellent manner. In the weeks, months, and years ahead we urge your support to complete this project by approving a \$15 assessment re-roofing increase to be voted on prior to the April 1, 1990 effective date. 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
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
