Annual holiday arts and crafts show Nov. 15-16

The Torrance Craftsmen's Guild's 45th annual Holiday Arts and Craft Faire will **take place from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 15, and Sunday, Nov. 16, at the Torrance Cultural Arts Center.**

The weekend will feature guild members selling a variety of their handmade goods. The show's publicity chair, Myriam Dowdy, said the offerings will run the gamut from quilts to aprons to pottery, all sorts of jewelry, paper items, handmade cards and woodwork.

She said over 100 vendors will be on hand selling items, and the event is free and open to the public.

In addition to crafts and handmade goods, she said food will be available for sale at a snack bar, and Santa will be on hand both days for free photos with kids from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Live music from DJ Ozzy will be spun in the center's courtyard, and there will be door prizes and drawings.

Over the course of the weekend, Dowdy expects a few thousand people to visit the show.

The Torrance Craftsmen's Guild is a nonprofit organization chartered by the city of Torrance and sponsored by the Department of Parks and Recreation. It was created 40 years ago when a small group of artisans came together to share their enthusiasm for the creation of handmade crafts.

Over the years, the purpose of the guild has been to promote the interest of arts and crafts in the local community. Over time, it expanded to reward individuals for their endeavors in arts and crafts by providing scholarships to high school seniors in the Torrance Unified School District. The fall Arts Fair -as well as a similar event in the spring - raises funds to support scholarships.

This year, the guild is providing scholarships to three graduating Torrance High School District seniors.


