## IF WE CAN'T REACH YOU, WE CAN'T ALERT YOU

The City of Torrance mass notification system, TorranceAlerts, enables you to receive informational messages from the City in the event of an emergency. It also lets you customize what other, non-emergency information you want to receive from the City.

TorranceAlerts is a free service provided by the City to help you get the information you need, when you need it. Registering for the system should be part of your emergency preparedness plan.

Information from TorranceAlerts will help keep you updated should the City or region experience a significant event such as an earthquake, fire, public health emergency or similar situation.
